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Dear Biathlon Friends,

It is with great joy that I welcome you to the IBU Youth/Junior World Championships 2022 in Soldier Hollow, USA.

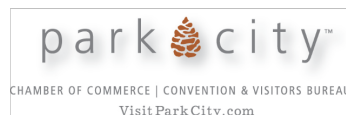
Biathlon, like all sports and all industries, is still facing challenges related to COVID-19. Last season, it was disappointing but necessary to accept changes to our original plans. We agreed to cancel all IBU Junior Cup events for the 2020/2021 season and support regional events where we staged a reasonable number of competitions for youth and junior athletes. The importance of the IBU Youth/Junior World Championships 2021 for young athletes was, therefore, more significant than ever, and we were lucky to have Obertilliach as a host. France finished as the most decorated nation by winning 11 medals; seven of them were gold. Emilien Claude was the absolute star of Obertilliach as he won a gold medal in the sprint and in the pursuit. He also anchored the French relay to a win and won Bronze in the individual. His was a beautiful story about more than just sport, just like the one of Amy Baserga of Switzerland, who won gold in the sprint and in the pursuit. Lena Repinc of Slovenia won all four available medals in the youth women competitions while Denis Irodov of Russia dominated in the youth men's field. He won all available gold medals in the individual competitions while shooting a combined 49/50. It was also the first time in the history of the IBU Youth/Junior World Championships that all four youth and junior winners in the sprint followed up their wins with another gold medal in the pursuit. The championships in Obertilliach also flourished in terms of TV ratings. An estimated 25% more people watched the event compared with the year before.



After the success in Obertilliach, we are delighted to bring the IBU Youth/Junior World Championships to Soldier Hollow and the USA for the first time since Presque Isle hosted the event in 2014. Soldier Hollow is a renowned Nordic and biathlon center with an illustrious Olympic history. It hosted the BMW IBU World Cup competitions in the 2018/2019 season and the biathlon events at the Olympic Winter Games 2002. Everything thus looks set for another thrilling IBU Youth/Junior World Championships and for as yet unrecognized talents to break through in Soldier Hollow.

I wish us a lot of biathlon-related joy and the continuous support of luck!

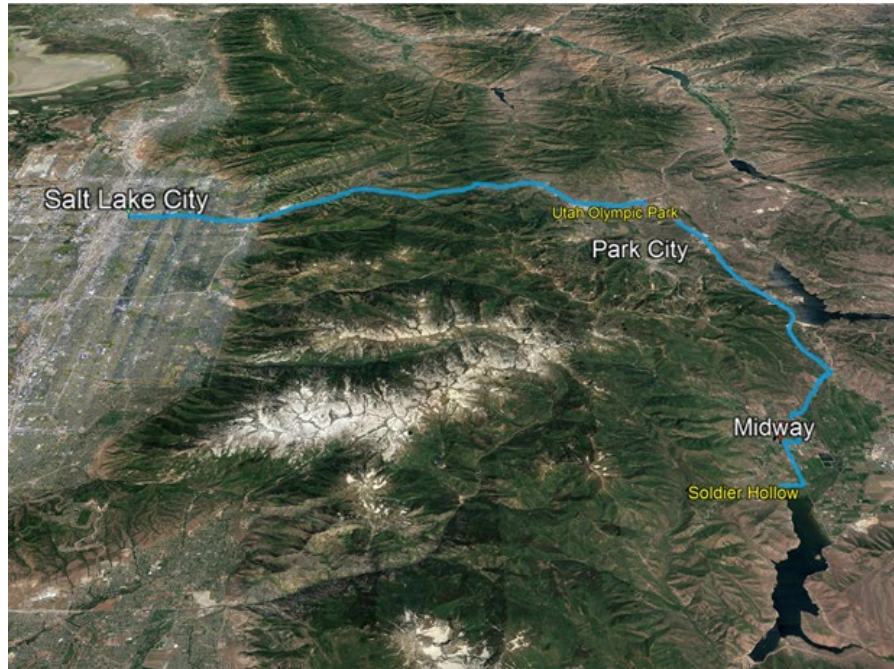

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A. General Information





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Soldier Hollow quick facts:

- Soldier Hollow Nordic Center hosted the 2002 Winter Olympic and Paralympic Cross Country and Biathlon events.
- Midway Population: 5,360 (2020 census)

A.1 Competition Venue

The Soldier Hollow Nordic Center has 31 kilometers of classic/skating tracks and a biathlon range, all nestled above the picturesque town of Midway, Utah, at Wasatch Mountain State Park.

- Soldier Hollow is about 80 km southeast of the Salt Lake City International Airport.
- The facility includes a main lodge overlooking the Stadium areas. For the IBU Youth and Junior World Championships, an Athlete's Compound will be created, including wax and changing cabins for all teams.
- The range has thirty lanes, equipped with a HORA 2000E target system.
- The altitude at the stadium is 1,695 meters.
- The average temperatures in February are +4°C high and -11°C low. Average snow depth for that period is 58.42cm.

A.2 Travel to Soldier Hollow

Flight Selection

There are no planned charters for this event. The OC recommends considering the following items when booking your flights. Nobody should transit with a rifle through Paris, Amsterdam, or London if possible. We recommend booking a direct flight out of Europe with the first stop in the United States. However, stops in Munich or Frankfurt may be needed. Wherever the 1st stop is in the US is will be where you will clear customs with baggage, equipment, and rifles. It is recommended that layovers in the 1st US arrival airport should be no less than 2 hours long to provide enough time to clear customs with luggage and firearms. Note that bookings made with Lufthansa require ticketed passengers to call the airlines after booking and well ahead of departure to register with them your intent to fly with a firearm. Team leaders are encouraged to check ahead of departure date with whichever airline they choose to fly in order to ensure safe passage of firearms.



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Arrivals

Official arrival day is Monday, February 21, 2022. There will be direct shuttles from Salt Lake City International Airport to Zermatt Resort for Teams that have requested OC transportation. The cost of transport is \$100 USD per person. **Please use Annex form D for booking**

Equipment Arrivals

The Soldier Hollow OC will have staff at the Salt Lake City Airport to assist teams with tagging bags and equipment. Personal luggage, including firearms, should be taken on the athlete transport. However, it will be possible for additional personal luggage to go to the hotels on the equipment transport. Ski equipment will be sent directly to the wax cabins and placed in the team cabins.

Departures

Official departure day is Thursday, March 3, 2022. Bus transport service is planned from Zermatt Resort to the Salt Lake City International Airport for teams that have requested OC transportation. **Please use Annex form D for booking Arrival/Departure Transport.**

Equipment Departures

OC trucks will be loaded at the wax cabins Tuesday, March 2nd after the last race. The equipment will travel to the Salt Lake City International Airport on March 3rd with athlete transport.

Upon arrival, teams should report to the Accreditation Office to confirm their participation numbers and receive accreditation.

Please note that accreditation will be issued only upon presentation of a valid negative COVID-19-PCR test (not older than 72h from sample taking) or presentation/upload (IBU Membercenter) of vaccination/recovery confirmation. Participants must also sign the IBU COVID Declaration (Annex 1 IBU Event Guidelines - COVID-19).

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A.6 Liability & Insurance

The organizer cannot be held liable for any damages done to persons or material/equipment. All participants must be covered by sufficient health, accident and liability insurance. By submitting the Entry By Names the National Federation confirms that all persons entered are covered by such insurance (in accordance with 1.5.2 b IBU rules).

A.7 Application/Permit for Temporary Importation of Firearms and Ammunition for All Nations

- All persons bringing firearms or ammunition into the United States for sporting purposes must first obtain an approved "ATF Form 6NIA" (5330.3D) Application and Permit for Temporary Importation of Firearms and Ammunition by Nonimmigrant Aliens," from the US Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms (ATF).
- Forms are [available for download](#) and are also included as **Annex C**. This application is FREE and must be completed for **all possible and potential Team athletes**. This will help to prevent any problems when entering the country. Each application certification statement in question 17 must be signed by the athlete (or the trainer in the case of spare rifles).
- All completed forms to be emailed to Mari Riser at yiwchvisarifle@uolf.org
- OC Soldier Hollow will verify that your forms are filled out correctly and we will send them to the U.S. Department of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms (ATF).
- By US law, all rifle cases on airlines must be securely locked and the lock must be visible. If the case is flexible and can be opened even with one lock, then 2 locks (one at each end) must be used.

A.8 Radio Communication Equipment

The United States Federal Communications Commission (FCC) requires that all radio equipment be operated with a Special Temporary Authority certification for the period of the event.

The fee for each operating frequency requested is **\$75 USD**, payable to the OC.

Please supply the information on **Annex B Registration of Radio Frequency** for each frequency requested by 17 December 2021.

The OC Soldier Hollow will compile the information and submit a single request for a Special Temporary Authority to the U. S. Federal Communications Commission.





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A.9 Passport & Visa and Regulations

Passport Requirements

To enter the United States ALL PERSONS will need:

- A machine-readable passport – or e-passport (with digital photograph) valid for six months past your expected stay in the U.S. CZE, EST, GRE, HUN, LAT, LTU must have electronic passports with an integrated chip.
- See important information about additional [digital photograph and e-passport requirements](#) for Visa Waiver Program travelers.

Visa Requirements

There are two ways to obtain visas to travel to the U.S: (1) Visa Waiver Program and (2) Obtain from U.S. Embassy.

Nations able to use the Visa Waiver Program with an approved ESTA application include:

- AND, AUS, AUT, BEL, CHL, CRO, CZE, DEN, ESP, EST, FIN, FRA, GBR, GRE, GER, HUN, IRE, ITA, JPN, LAT, LIE, LTU, NED, NOR, NZL, POL, SLO, SVK, SWE, SUI

Nations that require a Visa from a U. S. Embassy to enter the U.S. include:

- ARG, BLR, BIH, BUL, CHN, KAZ, KOR, MDA, MKD, ROU, RUS, SRB, TUR, UKR

Procedures for both methods are outlined below.

Visa Waiver Program (VWP) with an approved ESTA Application

To use this program, you will need:

- A machine-readable passport – or e-passport (with digital photograph) valid for six months past your expected stay in the U.S. CZE, EST, GRE, HUN, LAT, LTU must have electronic passports with an integrated chip.
- See important information about additional [digital photograph and e-passport requirements](#) for Visa Waiver Program travelers.
- Approved ESTA application – (valid for two years or until passport expiration)
- Letter of invitation by name from US Biathlon Association
 - Fill out the *Request for Invitation Letter by Name (Annex A)* for Visa Application form included with the invitation.



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- Send Request for *Invitation Letter by Name (Annex A)* to Mari Riser - OC Soldier Hollow, Email: mriser@uolf.org by 13.12.21.
- You must obtain an ESTA application through the [Electronic System for Travel Authorization](#).
- When you have your ESTA you may apply for Visa Waiver at the U.S. border when you arrive.
- The purpose of your stay in the US must be for business or tourism and must be less than 90 days.
- If arriving by air or sea, you must travel on an approved carrier and have a return trip ticket to any foreign destination.

Applying for a Visa from a U.S. Embassy to enter the U.S.

- To find a U.S. Embassy near you, go to: <http://www.usembassy.gov/>
- Contact the US Embassy closest to you for an interview as soon as possible.
- An interview at the embassy consular section is required for visa applicants. The following are specific requirements which must be met by applicants to qualify for a visitor visa under provisions of the Immigration and Nationality Act. The consular officer at the embassy or consulate will ask you questions about these topics to determine whether you qualify for the visa. The *invitation letter by name* will answer these questions.
 - The purpose of your trip must be to enter the U.S. for business, pleasure, or medical treatment.
 - You must plan to remain for a specific, limited period of time.
 - You must have evidence of funds to cover expenses in the United States. You must have evidence of compelling social and economic ties abroad.
 - You have a residence outside the U.S. as well as other binding ties that will insure you return abroad at the end of your visit.
- Fill out the *Request for Invitation Letter by Name (Annex A)* for the Visa Application form included with the invitation. Send *Request for Invitation Letter by Name (Annex A)* to Mari Riser- OC Soldier Hollow: email: yjwchvisarifle@uolf.org by December 17, 2021.
- OC Soldier Hollow will send you an *invitation letter by name* from the US Biathlon Association, which you need for your interview and to apply for your visa.





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- Complete the Online Non-immigrant Visa Electronic Application, Form DS-160.

<http://travel.state.gov/content/visas/en.html>. Helpful Information for DS-160:

- The online form will “time out” approximately 20 minutes after the application has been idle. So “save” at regular intervals.
 - You may upload your photo. Please refer to the [Guidelines for Photographs - for Online Visa Applications](#) for detailed guidance for using a digital camera, and requirements for scanned images.
 - Save your application to a local/computer file before you submit it.
 - Click “save application to file” button to permanently save your application, then click the “save” button on the file download window.
 - You can create a group application. On the “thank you” page you will see an option to create a group application. When you select this option, certain information from your application, such as destination, will automatically be imported to and displayed on a new application. You will need to complete an application for each team member.
 - Submit Visa Forms with photos for all athletes and team staff as a group (if possible or in two groups) with your invitation by name from US Biathlon. The cost per visa is normally \$130-140 but it can be more for some nations. There are very high EXTRA fees for getting a visa quickly – as much as \$300 per visa.
 - Print the confirmation page and bring the confirmation page to the interview.
- You must have a valid passport for travel to the United States and with a validity date at least six months beyond the applicant's intended period of stay in the United States. If more than one person is included in the passport, each person desiring a visa must make an application.
 - You must provide one (1) 5cm x 5cm photograph. See the required photo format explained in [Non-immigrant Photograph Requirements](#).
 - Non-immigrant visa application processing fee - For current fees for Department of State government services select [Fees](#). You will need to provide a receipt showing the visa application processing fee has been paid when you come for your visa interview.



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- Visa issuance fee – Additionally, if the visa is issued, there will be an additional visa issuance reciprocity fee, if applicable. Please consult the [Visa Reciprocity Tables](#) to find out if you must pay a visa issuance reciprocity fee and what the fee amount is.
- It is important that you refer to the Embassy Consular Section website to determine visa processing timeframes and instructions, learn about interview scheduling, and find out if there are any additional documents required. Learn more by contacting the [U.S. Embassy or Consulate](#).

THE OC SOLDIER HOLLOW AND THE US BIATHLON ASSOCIATION WILL ASSIST WITH VISA APPLICATIONS. BUT YOU MUST FOLLOW THIS PROCEDURE AND ALLOW ENOUGH TIME.

COVID-19 Restrictions & Testing Requirements for U.S. Entry:

- The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) may change testing and requirements for residents and non-residents traveling to the U.S.A. at any time prior to the beginning of the event.

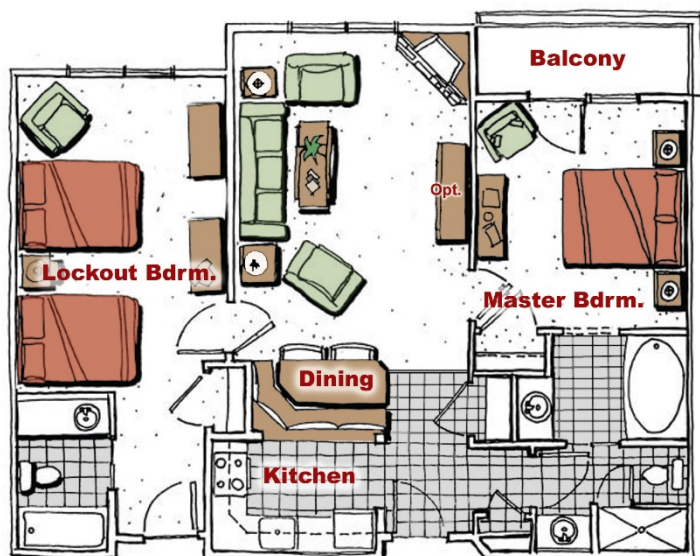

- The OC will work to grant your team accommodation type request. **Room allocations takes place as a first come first serve principle.** We encourage you to register for rooms as early as possible using the [Online Room Request Form](#).
- By the December registration deadline (21.12.2021), you will receive an update of your accommodation. Please note that changes may still be made after this.
- Deadline for changes is **07.02.21**. Then we will confirm your accommodation.

B.3 Accommodation Expenses and Payment

Payment is due by 17:00 on 22.2.21 in the Competition Office.





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B.4 Transport

Official arrival day is February 21, 2022 and official departure date is March 3, 2022. If you would like to arrive earlier than February 21, please request and we will inform you if the Transport Office is able to arrange transportation for you. Transport cost is \$100 per person from SLC International Airport to the Zermatt and \$100 per person from the Zermatt to SLC International Airport. To book transport, please fill out **Annex D Request for Transport** form and send it to tbarnhart@uolf.org by 15.01.22.

During the event from February 21 to March 2nd, transportation is available from the Zermatt to Soldier Hollow venue and back again. Transport schedules will be available upon check-in at the Competition Office and also in the Information Office at the Zermatt.

B.7 Anti-doping control Station

The Anti-doping Control station is located at Soldier Hollow within the Waxing Cabin Compound adjacent to the Stadium and Competition Management Building.

B.8 Waxing Facility and Wax Test Area

Wax cabins are located close to the stadium. Keys will be distributed by the Competition Office and require a **deposit of \$50 USD** per team. All wax cabins will be equipped with 110-volt power. Transformers are required in order to operate equipment requiring 220-volt. Transformers are available for rent at the Competition Office for **\$75 USD per unit**. It is recommended that teams reserve transformers ahead of time with the OC.
